What does healing look like in your context?

What systems for communication and organization do you have in place for care ministry?

Who visits, and when do visits occur for members and guests in hospitals, nursing homes, rehab centers, and at-home care?

What does care and healing look like for children and youth in your church and community?

Do you have a prayer ministry? How are the prayers being organized and documented, and how do you follow up on prayer requests?

What areas of care are needed that are not yet available within your church? What underlying concerns need to be addressed? (e.g., grief support, recovery ministries, justice work, elder care, home-centered care, expanding the communion table, prayer ministries, organizational needs)

What justice, compassion, and mental health support and resources do you offer or connect people with?

What care and healing needs do you observe outside the church's walls in the community (those in the community who could benefit from care and healing)?

What resources and organizations do you partner with in your community, or could partner with, that support the work of care and healing?
